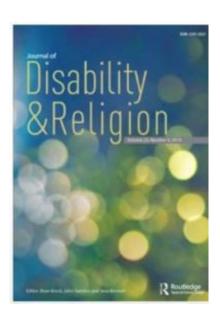





1 Corinthians 12:12-27

26% or 1 in 4 of ALL American adults have a disability



- IDEA highlights:
- Disability is a natural part of the human experience and in no way diminishes the right of individuals to participate in or contribute to society. Improving educational results for children with disabilities is an essential element of our national policy of ensuring equality of opportunity, full participation, independent living, and economic self-sufficiency for individuals with disabilities.

Something to consider . . .

- There are over 385,000 places of worship in the US (Brauer, 2017)
- 80-85% of churches don't have any type of any level of special needs ministry
- More than 90% of church-going parents of children with special needs site the most helpful support is a "welcoming attitude towards individuals with disabilities." Only about 80% admit to experiencing such. (The Banquet Network, 2018)

How could we make our congregation more inclusive and welcoming for people with mental health challenges and/or special needs?



- When new members join, ask in a sensitive and dignified way if any accommodations would enhance their participation in the faith community.
- State all are welcome and provide a phone number if additional accommodations are need in all church event announcements.
- Personally invite individuals with mental health challenges or special needs and their families to participate in ministries, religious education programs and events, and arrange for accommodations.

Believe in Ability means Black Lives Matter.

Act with Compassion means Black Lives Matter.

Enable Excellence means Black Lives Matter.

Foster Collaboration and Build Community means Black Lives Matter.

Promote Advocacy means Black Lives Matter.

Take Responsibility means Black Lives Matter.
